# SURVEY SAYS BY MIKE BAILEY

The Survey Results from Steve Beckstead are in and were announced at the Election / Planning Meeting in January. The statistics are quite interesting to see what the Utah Members think about the club and what direction they want the club to take on certain issues and items. As you all know, Steve put out a Survey Questionaire just before the holidays. The survey consisted of about 10 main questions with several answer options to check off. Here are the results of the Survey:

The first question was about how happy members were about the decisions made my the club officers and directors. 83% of respondents overwhelmingly said the officers were doing a great job and made good decisions for the club. This is very satisfying for us to know. 59% of members did not want a big major event like Miatas in Moab for us to do every other year, and thought 3-5 years would be better and 14% of the same group liked it the way it has been. 14% thought they were too much work, and another 14% did not have an opinion one way or the other.

On the matter of Dues; 79% thought the dues were the right amount to pay and 17% were Ok with a slight dues increase if it meant more "Free" activities or for the club to cover more costs of some things that member shell out money out of their pockets for. On the Privacy issues concerning our Facebook pages r the website, 45% were ok and didn't have a concern about the way we post our information for the public to view. 28% would prefer more controls on information we put out.

On the Newsletter 52% like how it is currently and how it has been over the past several years and read it completely all the way through each month. 31% thought is should be about 10 pages in length. 17% openly admit that they do not read it or just skim through it. Personally, I think that we have one of the very best Newsletters out there and I have read many Miata club newsletters from lots of clubs.

Concerning our club Membership size, 52% like the club just the way it is with our current membership and how we go about promoting the club my tagging cars or by word of mouth and getting our Dealer sponsors to help us with free memberships. Our Dealer sponsor is the main way we get new members and we appreciate them so much for doing this for us. 14% would like to see membership grow via public Facebook pages, Miata.Net or other methods. 24% did not have an opinion or offer one on this subject.

The UMC members occasionally go to plays or other non-car-related events. 55% of members enjoy these activities and attend many or most of them. 28% go to some of them at times and enjoy them. 17% really did not have an opinion about this, but 0% (or no one) replied with anything negative about this. Concerning the Annual Summer Picnic or BBQ, 41% prefer it to be in August, 38% said June, 3% July and 21% didn't care or have an opinion about it.

For the last set of questions, one was about the annual Halloween party. 38% like the parties whether bowling or at a clubhouse or elsewhere and dressing up was ok. 28% said it was not their favorite thing to do, but would go or participate because their Miata friends did so. 14% did not enjoy these kinds of parties and probably would not attend and 21% did not really have or express an opinion. On Birthday recognitions, 83% liked the fact we recognize member's birthdays on a monthly basis. 79% like the monthly drawing for small gifts with the tickets that we draw. We have decided to keep doing those things.

On General questions, answers were as follows: 52% enjoyed longer trips the most and want to increase their participation in trips that last a week or more. 79% wanted shorter, 2-3 day trips which were better for their schedules or what they could afford. Note, that there are a lot of members that still work a regular job, but also a lot of the group are retired and have more time, but perhaps less money to spend. Another 52% replied that their favorite drives are One-Day drives without overnights anywhere. 48% liked going to other Miata Club events as guests where they do all the organizing. 21% said it was very important the more things (drives and activities) are done in the Summer months off the school year schedule. 55% would be interested in another Caribbean or lower priced cruise organized by the club. (Note: for years we did an annual yearly cruise somewhere; some were for a week and some were 2 weeks in length).

These are the results of most of the Survey questions. Check out the percentages and see where you fit in on the survey results. Thanks to Steve for putting this all together. May it help us to be a better and more efficient club. Zoom - Zoom!



They have been longtime members of the UMC ever since I can remember, some 8-10 years at least. Their membership expired only a few months ago and Mark thought it best to not renew due to Marlene's health condition. They own a 3rd generation white Miata with the Gold Stripe down it. We



have hooked up with them on several occasions through the years during drives to Southern Utah and also attending some of the Tuachan events there. One time in 2009 we all went to Sedona, Arizona to an event there, which Mark led for part of the way. We had lunch at Red Robin in Washington, Ut. where their daughter works and have also been to their home. Another major trip they went on was the Great Western Adventure in 2013 and we indeed enjoyed their company on that trip. We have some great memories together with the Remingtons.

Needless to say, it is very sad when one of our members has failing health. Her condition is slowly getting worse as her husband, Mark, puts it. She has lost the ability to walk and hold herself up by herself. She is in a powered Jazzy scooter pretty much all the time to get around, unless she is in her bed. She is slowly losing her ability to write as well as type on a computer. Incidentally, Marlene worked with me on the original logo design of the Miatas in Bryce logo from an illustration that Val Francis Sturm drew from a contest we had in the club to come up with a logo design. Marlene used her amazing graphic artist talent to put a Miata on the top of the Hoodoo rock formation. At first it was a 'character' Miata car which was very cute and loveable. It was much like the Miata on their Day Tripper Club logo. We actually used both the character Miata and a real Miata for the event logo. Marlene was very efficient and accommodating in working with me on the logo.

Marlene's physician has told Mark and the family that her condition is terminal and although they do not exactly know what disease she has, the hospice physician says she has markers for ALS Disease more than anything else. Mark says unless you watch her talk and follow along reading her lips, you have a hard time understanding what she is saying. They are hoping she will live through this year but it is anybody's guess on how well she will do. They have to take her health condition week by week. Mark says she is in good spirits most of the time and her long term memory is still pretty good but short term memory is giving her issues. The Day Tripper's Car Club that Mark manages is in a holding pattern right now and it just depends on how things go with Marlene, on how much time he can put into that.

We want to wish Marlene and Mark all the best and we want them to know how much we love them both. We have tons of memories of our trips together. Our thoughts and prayers are with you. Your Miata friends will ALWAYS be with you.

Miata of the Month is a sleek, 4th Generation (ND) Miata called the "Char-S: Blackened Mazda Racing Concepts" Vehicle for the Tokyo Auto Salon. Mazda has come out with a trio of "Racing Concept" Miatas based on Production models. They wanted to promote their longtime feelings of "Kodo and Soul of Motion". Pictured is the RS Roadster Racing Concept. It has some very nice lines and the front and real air dam and side sills have a distinctive look to them with a red highlighted stripe. To me it is very sexy! The interior has a distinctive red stripe around the cool-looking bucket race seats, quite unlike the red stitching accent on the current ND model. There is also talk of a future MazdaSpeed variant of this Miata, which Miatafiles have been clamoring for since the first Speeds rolled out over a decade ago. If so, this would come to the top of my "want to purchase" list. Mazda has also come out with some other models that have the same look and features such as the CX-3 Racing Concept and the Atenza Racing Concept which looks a lot like a Mazda 6 supercharged car with very nice looks and lines.

The other two photos show the nice look of the Miata Racing MX-5. You can't argue with the fact that this is a very beautiful Track car. Notice the steering wheel on the right hand side to let you know this is for European and Asian driving enthusiasts.

### White Chocolate Almond Brownies.

12 ounces white chocolate, broken into pieces
1 cup or 2 sticks butter
3 eggs
3/4 cup flour
1 tsp vanilla
1/2 cup slivered almonds

Oven 325 f. Grease and flour 9 inch square pan.

Melt white chocolate and butter in large heavy saucepan over low heat, stirring constantly.

White chocolate may separate.

Add eggs; beat 1 to 2 minutes until smooth.

Stir in flour and vanilla until blended.

Spread batter in the pan.

Sprinkle almonds.

Bake 30 minutes or until set.

Cool completely.

### Sugar Cookies

Beat together 1 1/2 cup sugar . Sift 4 cups flour 1cup shortening 2 eggs, 1 tsp soda, 1 tsp vanilla Add 1/4 cup sweet milk Mix all together. Roll out. Bake 400 f. till light brown.
