After the meeting we'll go East on 2100 South to I-80 Parley's Canyon.


Exit 145 Kimball Junction, then to Kearns Blvd.

Rest stop and a treat at Exxon 7-11 in Kamas (nice store and restrooms).


- 2.9 Hours drive time for Full Route around Jordanelle, Heber City, Deer Creek, I-15 north to SLC.



I currently own a 2021 Grand Touring, Soul Red.

I got my first Miata one year ago, a 2020 Sport model. I have always wanted a two-seater roadster and due to family circumstances that opportunity came to me last year.

I learned about the Miata Club at the Bountiful Mazda Dealer. Took my last 2020 model there for service and Scottie told me about the club. Then, when I bought the new 2021, I received a free membership.



I was born and raised in central Minnesota. At 17 I joined the Air Force and for the next 30 years served around the world. Have been stationed in Mississippi, Japan, Taiwan, Viet Nam, Illinois, Florida, Colorado, Germany, Turkey, and Utah. My family traveled and lived in these places with me except for in Nam and Turkey.

My only career was the Air Force. After retirement at age 48 I did 12 years of volunteer work doing Meals on Wheels and teaching computers to the seniors in Davis County Aging Services senior centers. Also, for 9 years I worked for the State during the Legislative Session. I was the Sergeant at Arms for the House of Representatives for 8 of those 9 years.

My wife, Lois Jean, is from my hometown of St. Cloud, Minnesota and lived six blocks from my family home. I paid for her to fly to Taipei where I was stationed at the time, and we were married in downtown Taipei in a Chinese Court in 1965. We didn't understand a word that was said. I kept telling her all the years of our marriage, that maybe we weren't really married! She stayed with me the rest of the tour.

Lois and I were married for 54 wonderful years. She died a year ago. Sudden. Devastating. She was just terrific, followed me wherever I was sent, always my support.

We had two great sons, Brian, and Scott. Brian was born in the Navy Hospital in Taipei, in fact, he only had one tattoo on the bottom of his foot that read "Made in Taiwan".

Sadly, my son Scott died ten years ago at the age of 38, and my son Brian died three days before his mother who died just last year. That was my family.

Had two granddaughters. One, Kaitlyn, lives here near Ogden and has two terrific great-grandsons, Phoenix and Maverick. No better boys. The other, Jennifer, passed away also last year.

Lois and I had a magical 54 years together. We have been places and seen things that most people will never see or do. My sons were so good to us. Proud of both of them; proud of the men they became. All of our vacations for all 54 years were back to the families in Minnesota. After retirement we did 29 years straight. Great fishing back there!

Helper/Price UT Overnighter By: Roger Heath

Saturday, June 26th to Sunday, June 27th

Meet: Kamas Foodtown, 145 W 200 S, Kamas, UT, on June 26th @ 9:00 AM

Hotel: Greenwell Inn, 655 East Main, Price, UT (Single Queen Rooms \$55/nt, 2 Queen Rooms \$65/nt if you call @ 435-637-3520 and mention you are with the Utah Miata Club). Greenwell Inn in Price has offered a slightly lower nightly rate if you call. They do have an onsite restaurant with a 15% discount for breakfast and dinner if staying a night. However there are other hotels if you choose.

Short trip to explore Helper with an overnight in Price. If you can't stay the night you can do an out and back day drive to Duchesne for lunch with the group. Or to Helper, then drive home that late afternoon/evening. We travel to Helper on Hwy 35 and Hwy 87 to Duchesne and stop at the Duchesne City Park for lunch (corner of Center St and 400 S). After lunch we continue to Helper on Hwy 191. In Helper we may get a radio tour (stay in our cars and use our radios) of the history of the area and maybe visit the museums there. Later that evening we'll head to Price for the night. Price also has a nice Natural History Museum, and Nine Mike Canyon is nearby.



Sunday we have several options for the drive home, backtrack through Duchesne and Kamas, take Hwy 6 all the way to I-15 or the scenic route past Scofield Reservoir, through Fairview, Mt. Pleasant, Maroni and pick up I-15 in Nephi. We could also jump on the Nebo Loop however it may be crowded with campers going home.







Rocky Mountain Road Trip - Glacier Park Ticket Requirement

For those going on the RMRT, I just found out that Glacier National Park (along with others) are now requiring pre-reserved tickets to enter the park at Saint Mary, West Glacier and Camas Road, as well as the normal park pass.

Tickets go sale 60 days prior to our planned entry date and have to be purchased on recreation.gov or the app. Our planned date to enter Glacier is August 3rd. Everyone needs to create an account in recreation.gov, if you do not already have one, and plan to buy your ticket on June 4th beginning at 8:00 AM MST. The time will be confirmed prior to June 4th. Tickets are free but there's a \$2 service charge.



If everyone does not get a ticket we'll need to decide as a group to either split up, with some going through the park, or stay as a group and take an alternate route. We can still get into the park without a ticket, the Two Medicine area in the southeast corner and the Many Glacier area further north on the east side. However we would not be able to go through the heart of Glacier as we all have hoped to do.

Reminder: Rocky Mountain Road Trip: 7/31-8/7 By: Roger Heath



For those who have not signed up yet (like new members) the Rocky Mountain Road Trip is still on for late summer 2021. For those contemplating on going make your reservations soon as hotels are filling up or nearly full. The trip begins in the Harmons parking lot in Roy, UT on July 31st. Driving the backroads through Logan and Soda Springs we spend the first night in Jackson, WY. With an early morning start we drive north into Yellowstone, past Yellowstone Lake on our way to Cody, WY. After passing Cody we jump on the Chief Joseph Scenic Byway then turn on to the Beartooth Hwy, finally ending up in Red Lodge, MT. Day 3 is a casual drive to Great Falls, MT. Aug 3rd finds us heading towards Glacier NP. We enter Glacier on the east side and drive over the Going-to-the-Sun Road. We exit the park on the west side

and head to Bigfork, MT along Flathead Lake for the night. Leaving Montana, we head south along Flat Head Lake and into Idaho for the 4th night in Salmon. On the morning of Aug 5th we leave Idaho and head back into Montana on our way to West Yellowstone. Before we get to West Yellowstone we drive through two Ghost Towns, Virginia City and Nevada City. Virginia City would be a great place to stop and do a little site seeing. West Yellowstone will be the final stop for some, others we'll spend the day in Yellowstone NP and the final night in Jackson again. Please let me know if you are going so I can add you to the contact list I am compiling.

National Park entrance fees:Teton NP (only if we drive through on the way to Red Lodge, MT) \$35.00, Yellowstone NP \$35.00, Glacier NP \$35.00. Or use the America the Beautiful Annual Pass \$80.00. Or for Veterans and Gold Star families entrance is free with your ID card

Hotels: (this list is only a suggestion and where most have already booked)

- July 31st, Jackson: Ranch Inn, \$200/nt and up, or Antler Inn, \$250/nt
- Aug 1st, Red Lodge, MT: Red Lodge Inn, \$150/nt
- Aug 2nd, Great Falls, MT: Best Western Plus Great Falls, \$96/nt (military rate) and up
- Aug 3rd, Bigfork, MT: Bridge Street Cottages, one cottage left as of Jan 18th, \$425/nt

Alternatives In Bigfork Travelodge by Wyndham, \$131/nt and up, or Swann River Inn, prices vary by room.

Alternatives In Woods Bay (few miles south of Bigfork) > Mountain Lake Lodge, \$259/nt and up.

Alternatives in Polson (south end of Flathead Lake) > Red Lion Inn & Suites, as low as \$96/nt

- Aug 4th, Salmon, ID: Super 8, \$90.00 and up
- Aug 5th, West Yellowstone, MT: Hibernation Station, \$189/nt and up
- Aug 6th, Jackson (optional night): Ranch Inn
