

Future of Miata By: Mike Bailey

The Fourth Generation Miata (ND version) has now been around 6 years with the 2021 model soon coming out. Who knows when Mazda will decide to put out a fifth generation? The NA generation produced was made for 8 years, NB for 7 years, NC for 10 years, and ND for 6 years now. There is new color for the 2021 model, called Deep Crystal Blue with a new interior color of White Nappa Leather. This white is similar to the 2015 25th Anniversary Edition. This is only available on the GT or Grand Touring model, according to my search information on Mazda's website. The Snowflake White exterior color, will also be available in the 2021 model. This is the same white exterior color featured on the new MX-5 Miata celebrating the 100th Mazda Anniversary, that came out a couple months ago. This color option is going up in price a few hundred dollars more on the 2021 model than it was in 2020. MSRP pricing for the 2021 Miata ranges from \$26,850 to \$32,295 with special edition models a little higher. Mazda will feature most of the colors that were available in 2020, but not any other new exterior colors other than the Deep Crystal Blue. The 2021 Miata has a 2.0 liter, 181 HP at 7,000 RPM's in-line 4 cylinder engine. Three model options will be the same as





in previous ND models; Sport, Club, and Grand Touring (GT model) and price range will be according to the model purchased.

Mazda has put out a few Concept Versions with possible future changes, with a couple photos featured here. Many new concept versions are featured in various automobile magazines such as Car & Driver, and Motor Trend, as they always are. It is hard to predict what Mazda will do with making future changes to the Miata. Also Mazda does not seem to reply or comment on customer's questions as to when they will produce other popular colors like British Racing Green (BRG) as they featured in 1991 and 2001, or a Yellow exterior again (1992 Sunburst, 2002 Blazing Yellow, or 2009 Competition Yellow), or other distinct special colors. Reviews seem to constantly state that Miata people are tired of the same old whites or blacks, grays and silver versions. Who knows what Mazda will do for the future!
