West. Pull in by the Jr. High School.)


Due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, the meeting will be held at the Bountiful City Park east side by the playground. The parking lot is on the east side of the park by Bountiful Junior High School. The pavilions were already reserved, so bring your folding chairs, blankets, and lunch or snacks as we will be on the grass in the shade. Take the Bountiful 400 North exit off of I-15 and go east. The park is on the corner of 200 West and 400 North. The Parking lot will be approximately 100 West on 400 North.

If you plan on buying lunch, I would recommend you get off the freeway at Parrish Lane in Centerville as there are more drive-thrus to choose from; McDonalds ,Chic-filet, Toni-Burgers, In-and Out Burger, Subway, Etc.


After Meeting Drive Information:




The drive was excellently planned by a relatively new couple to the club, Bob and Kim Richards. Bob and Kim have taken



May Lunch and Drive Report Drive Report By: Mike Bailey


