

Miata Christmas Holiday Party


Date: Saturday, December 7th



2019 Texas Miata Round Up By: Susan Vaughn

Sunday, September 15, 2019, Mark and Susan Vaughn departed for the Texas Miata Round-up. We left early afternoon as Susan had a commitment for church. We drove to Monticello for the first night. The second day was a wonderful drive to Santa Fe. From there we traveled to Sweetwater, TX. A visit to the Women's Air Service Pilots (WASP) museum was in order. From there we were just three hours from Fredericksburg.


During WWII, between November 1942 and December 1944, 1,074 women were trained to fly first in Houston and then moved to Avenger Field in Sweetwater, TX. Nancy Love and Jacqueline Cochran founded the two programs (Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron and Women's Flying Training Detachment) that became the WASP. The women were necessary to keep the men at the war front. The museum is a great piece of history to visit.

The arrival in Fredericksburg was warm as members of the Bluebonnet Miata Club from San Antonio were on hand to greet the guests. Everyone was so helpful getting us to the registration, rooms, and general information. We were made to feel like one of the group.

The Bluebonnet Club hosted a dinner Friday night at the Woodrose Winery. The dinner was a Passport Dinner Italian buffet. Each course was accompanied by a choice from two different wines from their vineyard. This was a wonderful way to meet up with old friends and make new ones. No one was in a hurry to leave.

Saturday, brought on the drives. Starting early at 7:30 a.m. drives going to the Twisted Sisters or Regency Bridge, to 1:30 p.m. for shorter drives, there were 22 different times to leave. For our first drive we chose the Chisholm Trail. The Chisholm Trail was a trail used in the post-Civil War era to drive cattle overland from ranches in Texas to Kansas railheads. The trail was established by a Delaware scout and cattle rancher, Black Beaver and his friend Jesse Chisholm, who was a merchant. The southern terminus was a trading post near the Red River and the Northern terminus was a trading post near Kansas City, Kansas. Chisholm owned both trading posts.

The second drive was to Medina. Medina has been named the "Apple Capital of Texas" due to its abundance of apple orchards and the fact that they have hosted the international Apple Festival each year. The drive was full of hills and twist and turns. Just right for a Miata Drive.





Saturday night we were treated to a wonderful dinner at the Pacific Showroom in the Hanger Hotel. A Pacific theme was just the thing for the Thompson Miata Hawaiian print shirts. There were many in the crowd as well as old military uniforms and muumuus. The entertainment was a step back in time where legends entertained and sang.
